The Fulfillment of a Vision: Arya Kanya Gurukul – Porbandar

A resolute daughter's promise to "take care of Gurukul" doubled Nanji Sheth's enthusiasm, inspiring him to channel his industrialist energy into building Arya Kanya Gurukul in Porbandar. Choosing a plot of land near the Asmavati River, he envisioned Saurashtra's foremost institution for girls. In 1934, a mere idea from a public meeting blossomed into reality within two years, reflecting his unwavering determination.

Nanji Sheth's progressive vision was evident when he chose a Harijan girl to perform the groundbreaking ceremony, defying the rigid caste norms of the time. Despite initial challenges, Arya Kanya Gurukul opened in June 1937 with just seven girls, amid societal reluctance toward girls' education. Gradually, its unique approach gained recognition, leading to steady growth.

In 1940, 19-year-old Savita Nanji Mehta, a Gurukul alumna, assumed leadership. Deeply understanding the needs of her students, she integrated traditional and modern educational methods, fostering excellence in academics, arts, music, and dance. Her dynamic reforms extended beyond academics, involving students in creative and cultural activities through initiatives like the Saraswati Sabha, which nurtured their talents and holistic growth.

Savita's nurturing presence earned her the affectionate title "Didi" from her students, a name that soon resonated across Porbandar, Saurashtra, and Gujarat. Under her guidance, the Gurukul flourished, emphasizing physical fitness, yoga, and self-discipline alongside Vedic values. Her philosophy—"A strong mind requires a robust body"—remains integral to the Gurukul's ethos.

To promote the institution, Savita Didi led tours across Kutch and Saurashtra, where students showcased their talents, drawing widespread acclaim. Her dedication and innovative efforts transformed Arya Kanya Gurukul into a beacon of holistic education. Revered as a principal and a guiding light, "Savita Didi" continues to inspire generations with her enduring legacy of love and leadership.
